- A focused discussion on elaborating perspectives around cloud computing and the open source response was suggested by the drafting group.
- The Drafting Group have expressed a willingness to work on a set of associated targets to bring to the February Board AGM

- **Board Comments**

- “Cloud first” is an increasingly common policy/priority among CIOs; and “cloud first” often becomes “cloud only.”
  - Provide hosting for Apereo software in the cloud?
  - Desire of some institutions to move among cloud vendors/providers to gain better costs, services, etc.
  - What about creating a promotional list of Apereo software that is cloud-ready?
  - Should we communicate to products that they should consider provisioning for the cloud (to operate in the cloud and/or to function as a cloud service)?
    - Can we provide training opportunities, i.e. at Annual Conference, on how to make a service cloud-ready?
    - Providing training on how to make software “cloud-ready” could itself be a service that is attractive to open source projects not yet a part of Apereo
- Focus on collaboration efforts and models
  - How to build collaborations?
  - Presentations about the various collaboration models that exist within the Apereo community?
- Vendor/partner relations
  - Reach out to vendors to get their suggestions for strategic directions?
  - Consider suggesting that groups of schools establish themselves as providers of cloud service and support.
- We will publish the strategic planning draft sometime next week as a consultation draft for asking the community for input into strategic direction and planning.

- The OAE Project has completed the appointment of a new Project Lead, Miguel Laghina. Miguel will be seconded from his role at \*research to the project, and paid from OAE funds held by the Foundation.

### 3) Open Apereo Planning

- Conference planning is proceeding - the CfP (at the foot of these notes) is due to close on January 26th. Any help getting the CfP out to lists you participate in would e very much appreciated.

#### 4) MoU with ESUP Portail

- We are in the final stages of revising the MoU with ESUP Portail, which will be brought to the Board AGM in February.
- Given the growth in adoption of a greater range of Apereo software, formal liaison with ESUP-Portail will be increased to two long calls and two face to face meetings per year, aligned with existing events to minimise overhead.

#### 6) Incubation - EQUELLA and Notifications Backbone

- First calls for the two new incubating projects, EQUELLA and the Edinburgh Notifications Backbone have been held.
- Notifications Backbone has seen senior personell changes which will initially slow the project slightly. New incubation mentors Dede Hourican (Marist) and Lars Keisow (U Osnabruck) participated in the calls. The IWG continues to meet, and have agreed to produce a "Meet the Mentors" piece for the Apereo Newsletter to help raise the profile of incubation work.
- Mentor training provided by the University of Oxford Open Source Software Watch will take place beginning in late February/Early March
